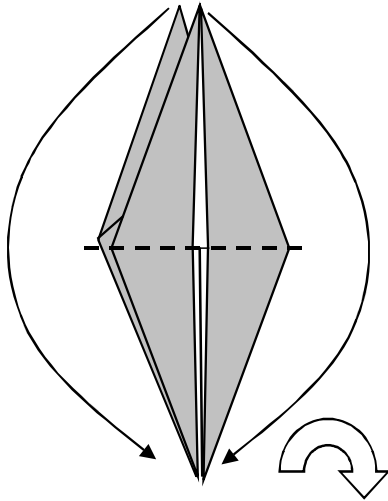


# Teapot

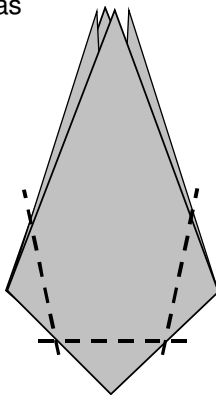

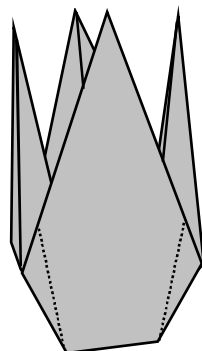
1. Start with the bird base from a square.



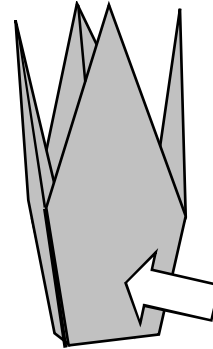
2. Make creases as shown.



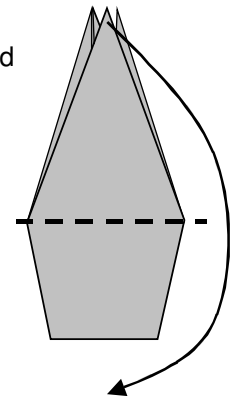
3. Open up the paper to make the bottom crease to mountain folds from all sides. Make the bottom flat.



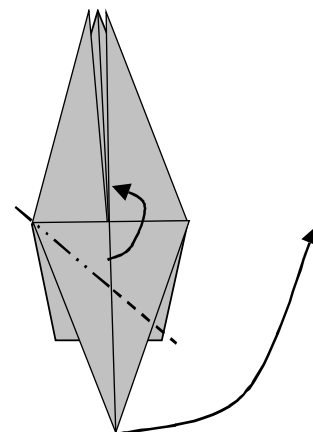
4. Make the slanted crease lines mountain folds too and sink in the sides. Don't sink with brute force; twist the paper from inside to sink.



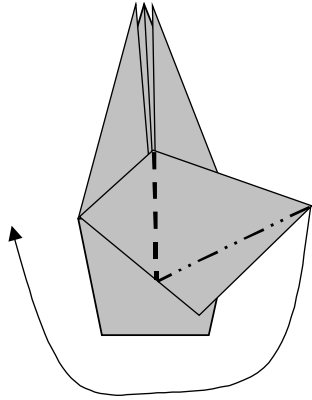
5. Flatten the design then fold down the front flap.



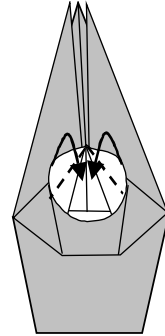
6. Squash one side of the front flap



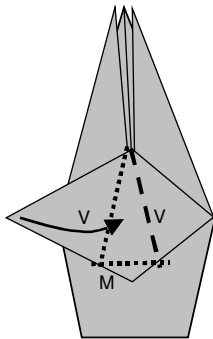
7. Fold as shown and squash the other side.



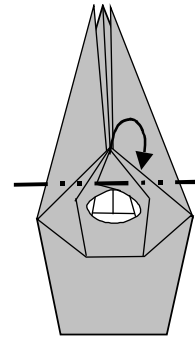
10. Fold in the top edges to overlap on top.



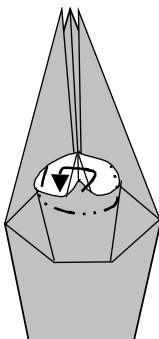
8. Form the spout with the 2 valley folds and the mountain fold.



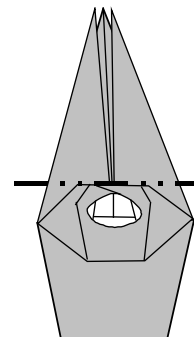
11. Fold back as shown to lock the top of spout.



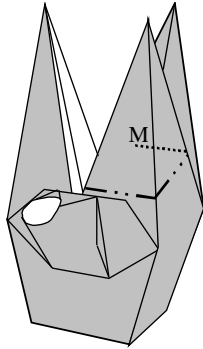
9. Fold in the tip of the spout.



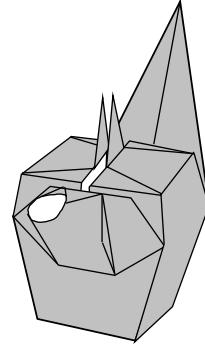
12. Make a mountain crease through all layers.



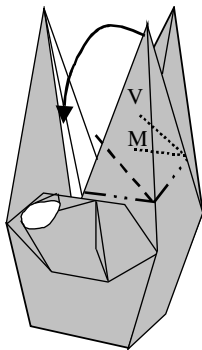
13. Open up the design and make the crease mountain on all 3 sides.



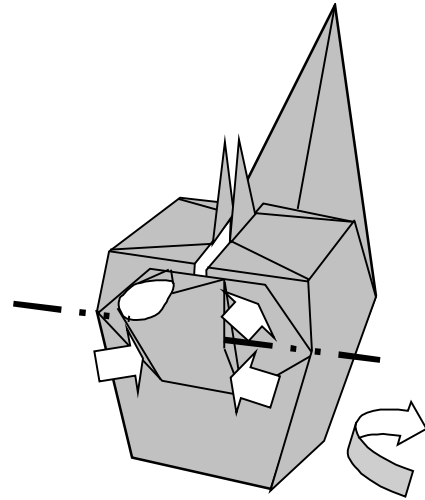
16. Repeat #13 to #15 symmetrically on the other side.



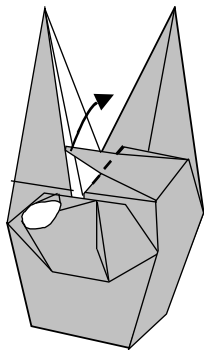
14. Add 2 valley folds and fold the tip flat.



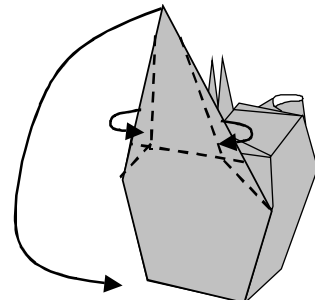
17. Make the mountain fold marked and reinforce the spout to fit the base of spout snugly over the bend of body.



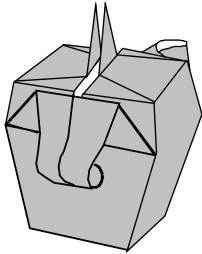
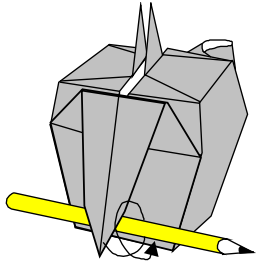
15. Fold upright the tip.



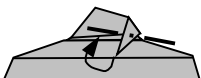
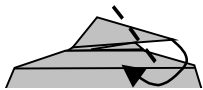
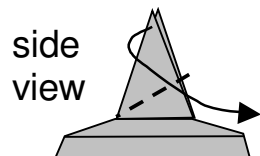
18. Fold as shown to make the handle narrower.



19. Use a pencil or stick to curl the handle.



20. Fold the top two tips together as shown and tug them under the flap to lock the top.
